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## Holocaust Memorial Day



Pupils across the school took part in activities to commemorate Holocaust Memorial Day on the 27<sup>th</sup> January. Every year the Holocaust Memorial Day trust have a theme to inspire remembrance, discussion and reflection for the millions who died during the Holocaust. This year's theme was 'One Day' which was to highlight how, for many victims of the Holocaust, their lives changed very suddenly, and in many cases in just 'One Day'. For some that was being torn from their homes or for others it was the day they were liberated, or even being reunited with family after the Holocaust.

Pupils took part in assemblies, where they learnt about the Holocaust and listened to a survivor's story, Mindu Hornick. In addition to this 30 year 9 pupils also had the opportunity to listen to a Holocaust Survivors story over Zoom as part of Islington Councils Holocaust Memorial Day service. Harry Olmer, now 95, was only 12 when the Nazi's invaded his homeland of Poland. He spoke for around 30 minutes in a very moving testimony and we all felt very privileged for being able to hear it.
