

Students completed bi-polar surveys to inspect numerous locations around the Quays and also conducted questionnaires to members of the public. It was great to see the confidence of our Y10 students approaching members of the public. Many students finished off the day with a trip to Nandos to fuel the walk back to school.

Students are now analysing the data they collected, back in the classroom to conclude their findings.

These are an example of best practice and definitely something that should be shared across the city'. Mrs Jurkiewicz, in the Inclusion department, has recently qualified to lead the 'Drawing & Talking' interventions and is now offering well-being Art sessions for over 40 pupils with heightened anxiety as part of the school's Graduated Response before a CAMHS referral.
