Dear Parent/Carer,

I hope that your child enjoyed a productive induction programme last week and that they have settled into the routines and expectation of the school as lessons have started this week. The message from teachers and leaders in the school has been clear and constant, pupils must work hard to be successful.

Although we have only just started the year, we need to make you aware of the date of the Winter exams. They will commence on Monday 6th November with the schedule lasting for two weeks. We will communicate the full timetable nearer the time. Following the examinations pupils will receive their working at grade and forecast grades for each subject on Friday 8th December.

The library will be open from 3pm to 4pm each day, exclusively for year 11 pupils as a safe a quiet place to revise. Any pupil using this facility will receive a token entering them into a reward prize draw at the end of the half term. The more tokens, obviously the greater chance of winning the reward.

Each pupil will have a 1 to 1 interview in the coming week with a member of the senior leadership team where their start to the year and their performance in the year 10 end of year exams will be reviewed. We will discuss their aspiration as they move on to college and set targets for improvement.

Homework is the easiest way in which pupils can take the initiative when it comes to independent learning at home. All subjects will set homework weekly and by the 22nd of September you should be able to see this on Class Charts. Should you have issues accessing your Class Charts account, please email me and I will resolve the issue. One of the induction sessions pupils had in the first week was on revision and revision timetables. Revision for the Winter and indeed the GCSE exams must start now, and we encourage you to discuss this with your child.

Maths

As we approach an important juncture in your child's academic journey, your child will complete a baseline assessment in maths in the first two weeks of term. This assessment serves as an initial benchmark to gauge your child's current knowledge and skills in various topic within the subject. Based on these results, we will make informed decisions regarding their class placements, specifically whether they will begin with higher or foundation level courses. It's crucial to emphasise that these initial placements are not set in stone. We understand that students grow and adapt at different rates, and as such, these decisions can be revisited and adjusted as the year progresses. Our aim is to provide the best possible learning experience for your child, one that is tailored to their individual needs and aspirations.

College Open Days

During this term each student will receive a 1 to 1 interview with our Careers Advisor to begin to explore career aspirations and post 16 options, whether that be studying A-Levels or a vocational course, a T-Level, or an apprenticeship. To support these choices, we strongly recommend attending College Open Evenings.
