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Pastoral Support at Buile Hill

At Buile Hill, we have a dedicated pastoral team who work with our teaching staff to ensure that every child is given the support they need to develop their social, emotional and mental wellbeing, as well as succeed in the classroom.

Our Heads of Year are designated staff that oversee their year group and ensure that students are given the right support to meet our expectations on behaviour, attendance and punctuality.

Our attendance team work with students and families to identify barriers to students coming to school and work with a wide range of agencies to ensure that families are given early intervention and support where needed.

Our form tutors play an integral role to the pastoral systems here at Buile. As your child's main point of contact each morning, they are on hand to offer guidance and support and make sure that each student is ready to start the day in a purposeful manner.



Rewards

At Buile Hill Academy our rewards system is structured around the foundation of students' effort by simply trying their personal best through character and academic development. We recognise the importance of consistently celebrating students' achievements both, inside and outside of the classroom of which our system aims to present the opportunity for everyone to higher their individual standards within the reward categories and not accept any excuses.

Points and Celebrations

Personal Best points can be awarded by any staff member and later monitored during Friday's tutor time celebrations. Furthermore, the time is spent recognizing each students' weekly accumulation of points, attendance and star of the week.

Throughout the whole school, we use Classcharts to input PB reward points when pupils meet the relevant criteria of the following titles;

In addition, students who go above and beyond trying their personal best have a chance of being awarded star of the week and therefore receive a virtual badge via Classcharts, a certificate and a VIP breakfast voucher. The voucher is then used to purchase a free breakfast of their choice during Friday's tutor time celebration. Again, star of the week can be given through the following titles;

- PB Headteacher Star of the week
- PB SLT Star of the week
- PB HOY Star of the week
- PB Form tutor Star of the week

PB points and star of the week badges are awarded via Classcharts and offers the opportunity for both pupils and parents/carers to monitor and provide recognition for their achievements.

Our Curriculum

At Buile Hill Academy, we strive to give every student access to a curriculum that is broad, offering students the opportunity to engage with a wide range of academic and vocational disciplines.

We maintain high expectations of all students by ensuring that the knowledge students gain is challenging and academically rigorous. All students are catered for in each subject through careful planning, personalised provision and targeted academic support.

We expect our students to show a real commitment and passion for their learning. Students at Buile Hill demonstrate a curiosity in their subjects, using each lesson as an opportunity to further themselves academically. All students are expected to demonstrate resilience and engage with feedback so that they learn from mistakes, review their progress and strive to improve every day.

Our teachers, as subject experts, ensure that the knowledge students acquire is the most up to date and relevant in their relevant disciplines and our curriculum leaders continually review and adapt our curriculum to meet the needs of our students.

Each subject is carefully mapped out to ensure that over time, students learn more and remember more, so that when their five-year journey at Buile Hill is complete, they are prepared to be able to progress into further education, employment or training.

Through the curriculum, students learn about their subjects and apply their knowledge to real world examples and develop an understanding of the relevance of their subjects in the real world. We use our curriculum as a vehicle to enrich the lives of our students, raise aspirations and provide guidance for students to realise their future ambitions.

We aspire to provide the following opportunities as an entitlement during their time in one of our academies, to develop their social capital. These are Consilium's ten opportunities:


 A cultural event (a Shakespeare play, a classical concert/opera, visit a major art gallery).

Student Leadership

by giving them the opportunity to develop a range of skills which are transferable beyond their school years, it drives aspirations for all and enables pupils to become all round competent young people with confidence in their abilities. Giving students the opportunity to take on leadership responsibilities in the school is an important part of school life here at Buile Hill Academy.
