

Routes into work-based learning can include a traineeship where students develop employee skills, moving on to an apprenticeship, learning skills on the job. These are available in a range of careers within many industries from accountancy to construction, to media, recreation, travel, childcare etc.

### Apprenticeships and traineeships

If you've had enough of the classroom full-time, and yet still want to learn a new profession, trade or skill, then this could be the route for you, also you would get the chance to gain skills. Traineeships help prepare you for work and last up to six months. They offer maths and english training together with work experience to boost your skills and help you into an apprenticeship or job.

Apprenticeships are real jobs with training so you can earn while you learn and pick up qualifications as you go. Schemes take between one and four years to complete and run on three different levels, so you can choose a level that suits you.
